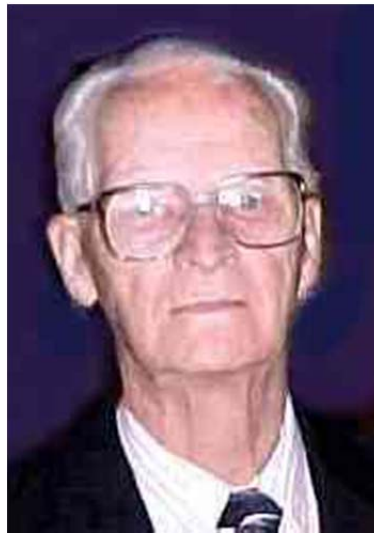


In Memoriam

George Longford Brierley

1919 - 2004



George Brierley - April 12, 1919 - February 5, 2004

George was a Saskatchewan boy, born in Grenfell in 1919. He moved to Calgary in the mid '40's and met his wife Ivy at Penley's Dance Emporium in downtown Calgary.

Married with 2 children and 4 grandchildren, George was a great Rotarian.

He joined our club in 1974, proposed by Clayton Carroll and seconded by George Adam. As the General Manager of White Trucks, where he worked for over 25 years, George's classification was "Truck Sales".

George was President of our club 1984 – 1985 year and had a remarkable perfect attendance for over 25 years. He was also a Director of the Waterton Glacier International Peace Park Association and along with Ivy, attended 25 Peace Park assemblies.

Rotary Service was George's way of "Discovering a New Way to Serve" his Community.

George reported:

"On June 3rd-7th, after a very pleasant tour of England and Scotland, Ivy and I, along with about twelve other couples from the Rotary Club of South Calgary and twenty-three thousand other Rotarians and Rotary Anns, attended the **Rotary International Convention** at the National Convention Centre just outside **Birmingham, England**. The emphasis of the convention was fellowship - "Sharing our Rotary fellowship" - to enable us to serve people better. Here were twenty-three thousand people from one hundred and fifty-seven countries gathered together without a common language but held together by a common purpose - the desire for fellowship and the willingness to serve.

Incoming Rotary International President, Carlos Canseco, spoke to us about his objectives. His theme for the Rotary year 1984-85 was "Discover a New World of Service". It was truly here that I realized the responsibility I had assumed when accepting to serve as your President for the Rotary year 1984-85"

George leaves his wife of 53 years Ivy, son Guy and daughter Gail plus four loving grandchildren. We extend our condolences to Ivy and family.
